「北東アジアの平和と安全保障に関する専門家パネル」
(Panel on Peace and Security of Northeast Asia: PSNA)

2017年6月24日(土) - 25日(日)の2日間にわたり、標記第2回会合が、Asia Pacific Leadership Network for Nuclear Non-Proliferation and Disarmament (APLN)北東アジアグループ、並びに地元NGO団体ブルーバナーとの協力の下で、ウランバートル(モンゴル)で開催された。今回モンゴルで開催した理由の一つは、北朝鮮からの参加を可能とすることであり、招待状を発送したものの、残念ながら今回も最終的には北朝鮮からの参加は実現しなかった。その中で、トランプ新政権の核政策、核兵器禁止条約交渉の今後、北東アジア非核兵器地帯実現への課題、そして北東アジアにおける民生用原子力利用の課題、の4つのセッションで活発な意見交換が行われた。
